Power of God's Word

- God's word causes us to be equipped as God's servant. The Bible is our basic equipment and training tool. Bible teaches us what to believe and how to behave in this world. 2 Tim. 3:16-17

Spiritual Swordsmanship

- Apostle Paul writes in Ephesians 6:17 "Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God."
- Sword is to be used both for offence and defense. Jesus Used the word of God to defeat Satan. Matt. 4:1-11

Spiritual Swordsmanship

Jesus defeated Satan by using the word of God correctly. He used it to defend himself and also to attack Satan. He was also led by the Spirit (4:1). Holy Spirit was reminding him, what to say to Satan. This was possible because Christ has hidden God's word in his heart.
